Book Review: Multiplying Churches in Japanese Soil

Reflections by Ray

When I saw *Multiplying Churches in Japanese Soil* pop up on my Amazon recommendations stream, unsurprisingly, it immediately caught my attention. I looked at the sample, looked into the background of the author, and bought the book shortly after. I can tell you that I have absolutely no buyer's remorse.

The author has a Doctorate of Ministry in Missiology from Trinity International University which is, as you might guess, affiliated with

Trinity Evangelical Divinity School which has an all-star list of notable faculty and alumni. He has been a missionary in Japan since 1985 and is associated with a number of missions organizations.

Challenges of Doing Missions in Japan

Getting right down to it, I found this book to be extremely helpful and refreshing. Over and over again the author makes observations and gives insights into challenges of doing missions in Japan that I have found to be true myself. Here is just one example:

"The underlying reasons, namely the lack of faithful application of essential biblical principles, are paralleled in churches of other countries and among other people groups. But each of these reasons for the lack of healthy growing churches may be reinforced by Japanese culture and even some Japanese church practices."

In doing missions, there needs to be a respect for culture, but in areas where the culture conflicts with biblical principles, the Bible must take priority. In the past, missionaries made the mistake of completely disregarding culture but I feel that the pendulum has swung the other way and there are times where the culture takes priority over biblical principle. My brothers, these things ought not be so. There is much more to say about this but I need to resist the temptation to get into too much detail in a short review for a newsletter.

A Book with Solutions

We recently reconnected with Soga-san from Hamadera Bible Church - his wife and son are in the same Mommy and Me class as Shelley and Masanobu!

The author not only makes keen insights in the challenges of doing missions in Japan, he also provides solutions. There is a whole chapter on strategy as well as a chapter where he gives examples of churches that he believes are doing things right. It was nice to see a friend's church mentioned in the book. He was one of the speakers at a conference that Japan Bible Academy (which I am a part of) put on. His church, Oasis Chapel, was mentioned for the work they did to help survivors of the 2011 disaster in the Tohoku region of Japan.

One Church for Every 14,000 People

I do want to mention one simple statistic that I saw in the book that I found insightful. The author mentioned that there are about 9,000 churches in Japan. I did a little math and discovered that there is about 1 church for every 14,000 people. I did the same math for the United States and discovered that the ratio is about 1 church for every 1000 people or so. In other words, the "church density" of the US is about 14 times that of Japan. Here's another way of putting it. If you take away 93% of the churches in the US, you would know what Christianity in Japan feels like. I did a lot of estimating and rounding but I hope that this difference gives you an idea of the lack of presence that the church in Japan has and why we are out here.

Concluding Thoughts

There are too many good things to say about the book for me to write them all down here. The book itself, not just a review of it, deserves to

The Tokaido Shinkansen high-speed bullet train line between Tokyo and Shin-Osaka is the most heavily travelled high-speed rail route in the world.



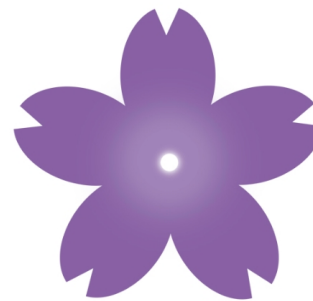
